The Villa NCEA Academy ('the VNA') offers a truly unique individualized educational experience that fully engages your child at the most critical time in their schooling. Children enrolling in years 11-13, follow the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) pathway as well as experience a level of personal support and teaching style that motivates them to learn and mature their thinking.



With very small class sizes (**just** 10 students per class), the academy can truly personalize and tailor learning to support students achieve their academic and personal goals.

Students attend school from 1pm-6pm. This allows them the morning at home to study. There is also flexibility in the day structure for students to pursue their extra-curricular interests.

Curriculum and Academic Information



NCEA is the main qualification for secondary school students in New Zealand. It is recognized by employers and used for selection purposes by universities and polytechnics both in New Zealand and overseas. At the VNA, students can take six subjects across NCEA Levels 1-3. Core subjects of English and Mathematics are taught by specialist teachers for one period respectively each day.

In addition, generalist teachers will support students to study three or four additional subjects of their choice (chosen in consultation with the Principal) through 'Te Kura', the Correspondence School'. 'Te Kura' provides distance education, in a variety of subjects, with the support of teachers and learning advisors, to ensure students reach their true potential.



NETNZ is also used in order to offer a broad range of subjects that are fully supported by both onsite and remote teachers.


Personal Support and Guidance

Academic counselling ensures students can follow a pathway to achieve the University of Auckland rank score for their chosen course of tertiary study, therefore encouraging students to achieve NCEA at Merit and Excellence levels. The approach also helps students to choose academic subjects that lead to high-quality degrees.

Location and Facilities

The VNA is co-located within Mt Hobson Middle School at 131 Remuera Road, Newmarket. The building is a 1900s Villa that provides excellent learning spaces, including a science room, an art room, a kitchen, and areas set aside for quiet, individual and group learning. The school has laptops that are available for use however students in VNA are encouraged to have their own laptops as this helps with work at school and at home.

Transport systems are excellent, as is access to a range of community activities to enrich the learning experience making the site stimulating and exciting, for students.

Uniform

Students studying at the academy are not required to wear a uniform. Instead they are encouraged to attend school tidily, dressed in smart, casual clothing.

Academy Rules

The Trust Board sets rules to ensure that all students are treated fairly and respect each other and their property. Rules may be changed from time to time as the Board sees fit. Given the location of the school and the frequency we are in the community; it is important that the rules are adhered to;

Attendance – students must attend each scheduled day. When there is sickness, or another good reason, the Academy must be notified as soon as possible on that day. When students return to the Academy, a written note is required.

Inappropriate Items – Items including gum, drugs, alcohol, cigarettes and inappropriate literature or electronic material are not to be brought into Mt Hobson Middle School or onto the grounds.

Internet Use – the Internet and e-mail facilities must not be misused in terms of sending or downloading inappropriate materials. All students/parents will be required to sign a standard Cybersafety Agreement Form.

Off-Site Behaviour – When off-site during school hours, Villa NCEA Academy students must treat all people with respect and obey all laws with regards to traffic.

2019 Fees:

Application Fee: (applies to newly enrolled students, those currently enrolled at MHMS are exempt.)	\$200.00 (non-refundable)
Entrance Fee: (applies to newly accepted students, those currently enrolled at MHMS are exempt.)	\$500.00 (non-refundable)
Tuition Fees for New Zealand Citizens and permanent residents:	\$15,000 (per year) Fees, as shown below, will be charged four times per year and are payable by the end of the first week of every term. - \$3,750 A discount of 5% is applied where there are two students from the same family. The discount increases to 10% when three or more attend from the same family. Discount applies to the tuition fee only.
Payment options:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A monthly payment option is available. - If the full year's fees are paid at the beginning of Term 1, a \$400 discount per family will be applied.
Course related costs: Due to new government legislation individual course costs may apply. This applies to Te Kura and NETNZ courses.	Examination fees for entrance into the NCEA standards: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Domestic students - \$76.70 per year - International students - \$383.30 per year (Please note, these figures are subject to change. NETNZ \$850 inc GST per subject Te Kura \$1500 inc per subject Plus course workbooks and materials.
